## Precept and Budget for 2023/24

The Parish Council is empowered to incur expenditure in the execution of its duties and work for and on behalf of the parish. The expenditure can include the employment of staff, running of community facilities, buildings and parish property: including maintenance and improvement and those statutory powers which the Parish Council agree to deliver. There is also a power to incur expenses for the benefit of the parish area for all or some of its residents.



The Parish Council receives the funds for expenditure via the means of precept, the precept is the money the Parish Council receives via Shropshire Council, the council responsible for collecting local government taxes, through Council Tax.

Those Councillors who are members of the Finance Committee have been working with the Clerk prior to her departure and have completed a piece of work to review the expenditure for this year (2022/23) and prepare a draft budget and precept for year 2023/24.

At the Full Council meeting held on the 8th December 2022 Resolution #FC22/156 those Councillors present at the meeting received a verbal update from the Chairman of the Finance Committee and the Locum Clerk regarding the draft budget for 2023/24 and the precept for 2023/24.

It was unanimously agreed by all Councillors at the meeting to set the budget and precept for Albrighton Parish Council with an increase of 3.5% to the precept for the financial year 2023/24.

Albrighton Parish Council's precept will be £183,750.00 an increase of £9,387.66 compared to last year.

Shropshire Council have also raised the Council Tax Base and Band D Properties will be at a rate of £111.23, an increase of £3.78 per household.

# **Albrighton War Memorial**

The Albrighton War Memorial Committee is making steady progress in developing the project and specification for the renovation works for our wonderful War Memorial.

The specification is one of the important elements for the project to ensure that the works being completed are correct. This piece of work requires lots of input from specialist restorers and the Council and Committee want to get this right.

At the Full Council meeting 8<sup>th</sup> December 2022 Resolution #FC22/160 the Council approved the quotation for the tree maintenance works surrounding the War Memorial. This is scheduled to take place in March, subject to the contractor's schedule. Thank you to those involved in the Albrighton War Memorial Working Group who have secured a crash deck to protect the War Memorial, this will be put in place whilst the maintenance on the trees is carried out to ensure the safety of the structure.

This group is to help teach anyone to knit or crochet or help people advance their skills.

### Warm Space at Library Meeting Room

The warm space at The Parish Office and Library meeting room has been open for a few months now and we are starting to see some regulars using the service. Albrighton Parish Council are very proud to be supporting our local community during a time where people are concerned about the rising costs of living and fuel bills. All residents of Albrighton are welcome to use the Warm Space regardless of your circumstances. This service will continue throughout the winter months, so please make use of the space, you don't need to be a member of the library to use it.

This warm space is working in partnership with Shropshire Libraries and Albrighton Parish Council have pledged £500.00 towards the set-up costs for this initiative. Thank you to Donington with Boscobel Parish Council who have also pledged money towards this vital project for our community.

There is free tea, coffee, and cuppa soup available and a selection of games and activities for those who wish to join in. There will be a community jigsaw puzzle available to complete by everyone and a daily crossword. Also available will be a selection of newspapers and magazines.

I hope everyone enjoyed the new Christmas Lights in the village this December, the Parish Council invested in upgrading and purchasing new Christmas Lights around the Village High Street. We have received a few comments asking whether the Parish Council will have Christmas Lights further down the High Street on both ends, at present there is no plan to purchase additional Christmas lights, but this may be something the Parish Council consider in the future. The Christmas Lights Committee will meet later in the year and any

decisions made will be taken to full council closer to the date.

The Chairman's Charity supporting the Albrighton Food Bank received an extremely generous donation from The Old Bush after they hosted a raffle in aid of the Foodbank - £100 was raised and tins of food were purchased to donate to the cause. Thank you to those of you were involved in the raffle night donating to this fantastic service for our community, special thanks to Councillor French who is the manager of The Bush for organising this! Albrighton Foodbank is situated at St Mary's Church Centre, High Street, and those in need are welcome to collect food parcels – no referral needed and sign up is not required.

Albrighton Library is a donation point and collection point for food parcels, we have a limited number available for those who are in needed. Thank you to St Mary's Church Centre for working in partnership with Albrighton Parish Council and for providing this service to our community.



Interviews for the Parish Clerk/Responsible Finance Officer/Proper Officer took place on Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> January which consisted of 3 councillors and myself included.
