The Albrighton War Memorial Committee is making steady progress in developing the project and specification for the renovation works for our wonderful War Memorial.

The specification is one of the important elements for the project to ensure that the works being completed are correct. This piece of work requires lots of input from specialist restorers and the Council and Committee want to get this right.

I hope everyone enjoyed the Coronation Bank Holiday Weekend, however you decided to spend your weekend whether you celebrated the Kings Coronation or decided to opt out of the Royal festivities. A lot of events were organised in the Village for all age groups to attend and we hope that these events had a good turn out and everyone enjoyed themselves.

Albrighton Parish Council purchased 700 Coronation Mugs to present to local primary school children to commemorate the Coronation of His Royal Majesty, King Charles III. On Friday 5th May 2023, I attended the local primary schools as Chairman of the Council in attendance with Vice-Chairman Sylvia Pledger and the Clerk to the Council, Joanne Oliver to present the mugs. The local schools celebrated the Coronation by dressing up for the day and holding a Coronation themed Art Competition. Albrighton Parish Council donated £5 book vouchers to each winning child, totalling £35 per school. We would like to thank the children for taking part in the Competition and to the schools for allowing the Council to attend an assembly to present the Coronation Mugs.



On Friday 5th May and Saturday 6th May, St Mary's Church held their Annual Beer & Music Festival and were able to stream the Coronation in the Church. I attended the event on Friday evening and Saturday morning to help with the festival in capacity of the Chairman and it was great that there was a big turn out for the event. St Mary's Church this year agreed that the funds raised by the Beer & Music Festival would go towards the War Memorial Restoration Project and we are pleased that around £4000 was raised but an update will be provided once we know the final figure.
