Following the passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II the Accession Council made an Order for Proclamations to be read to announce the Accession of His Majesty King Charles III as our new Sovereign.

The Chairman of the Council was formally invited to attend the reading of the Proclamation text which is laid down by the Accession Council at The Bandstand, The Quarry, Shrewsbury, SY1 1JA on Sunday 11th September 2022 at 1.00pm.
