Albrighton War Memorial

Albrighton Parish Council formed a Working Group in 2021 with local organisations and those with an interest in the War Memorial to conduct a refurbishment project to preserve the War Memorial for many years to come. Albrighton Parish Council are dedicated to the refurbishment of this important monument to remember those who dedicated their lives in World War I and II.

We are pleased to confirm that the planning application for Listing Building Consent has been granted – this will allow contractors to carry out the refurbishment of the structure in stages, to ensure the structure is protected whilst the work is being carried out. Albrighton Parish Council have contracted Jubb Clews for this project and orders have been placed for tendering for the works.



The refurbishment cost is estimated at £50,000.00, approx. £20,000.00 has been raised so far and the Working Group are progressing with applications being sought for funding from War Memorials Trust and the National Lottery. The Working Group are keen to work with local schools to carry out Educational Projects and are hopeful to make contact at a later date to promote the monument and the importance of remembering those who made the ultimate sacrifice for our country.

The Albrighton War Memorial Working Group are hopeful for this to be carried out after Remembrance Day, but with the complex process and procedures, we cannot guarantee this date and will endeavour to keep partners and the public updated.

Thank you to those who have been involved in the project to date and thank you to those who have contributed funding to the refurbishment.
