Albrighton Library, however, boasts an even deeper-rooted legacy. First opened in 1869, it has proudly served the local community for over 150 years—long before the establishment of the county-wide public library network. Over this remarkable span, Albrighton Library has grown, evolved, and adapted, supported by countless librarians, volunteers, and community members.


Originally located on the High Street in what is now the Rumbles Building, the library once occupied a two-storey space. In 1964, it relocated to its current home on Station Road, where it continues to be a cornerstone of the village. A significant change came in 2016 when management of the library transitioned to Albrighton Parish Council, ensuring its future remains locally guided and community focused.

As a special thanks to the many librarians who have worked here over the years, we are hoping to celebrate with a garden party—more details to follow.
